### **SCHOOL ARRIVAL**

Please remember to enter our campus using the entrance on Indiana Avenue. This applies to those using the upper or the lower lot. Please do not enter from Pennsylvania Avenue. Families using the lower level entrance exit our campus using Pennsylvania Avenue. We are trying to avoid having traffic from the lower lot exit using Indiana Avenue. This is for safety concerns. The corner of the gym creates a blind corner and very narrow path for two cars. The completion of the new dumpster enclosure will make this an even more dangerous path for two vehicles.

This year we are allowing students who arrive before 7:30 to enter the building. Those arriving on the upper lot may enter the outside doors. The inside doors will remain locked until 7:30. We are asking students who arrive on the lower lot to wait in the vestibule between the two sets of doors even though the interior doors are open. This procedure allows students protection from inclement weather.

We took the math portion of the MAPS test today. We will do the reading portion on Thursday.

The second graders have been working with Mr. Kramer for the chapel art this week. Thank you for sending in your child's baptismal picture and date. If you haven't had a chance to send it in, you still could send it to Mr. Kramer today (he sent out an email last week).

On Friday a permission slip for the KML play was sent home. We need one or two chaperones for the play. If you attended a volunteer training this year and are able to go with us, please let me know. The event is free for chaperones.

Many of the students are using the writing calendar found in the take home folder. Today we put a new calendar in the folder. This calendar asks the students to write a paragraph about the topic listed. Please see the directions on the bottom of the calendar for guidance.

Looking ahead: Next Thursday, October 18 is picture retakes. On October 21 we sing with the fourth graders at Good Shepherd for the 10:30 service.

Here's what we are learning this week:

- In Christ Light we are learning that the Holy Spirit works faith through Baptism and God's Word.
- In math we are working with three-digit numbers in unit, standard, expanded and word forms. A parent tips sheet is in the folder with further explanation. How well can your child count by tens? Have your child count by tens starting with 80 and ending at 1,000. Counting to the next hundred can be tricky for some (490, 500, 510, 520).

- The phonics skills this week are initial blends. We work with these words every day during the week, but your child may need extra practice at home to spell these words. The assessment will be on Friday.
- How is your child doing with the sight word books? Our goal in second grade is to read through all ten books. We listen to them read each week. Practicing at home is part of the weekly homework which will help your child meet the goal.
- In grammar we are working with singular and plural nouns.
- In science we are learning about physical and chemical changes in matter.

Tuesday, October 16 has been declared **Third Grade Rock Day**. The students are allowed to bring in no more than 3 rocks to share with their classmates. They should be in a labeled container so the rocks do not get mixed up.

We have decided to make a "classroom policy" concerning picking up of assignments when your child is ill. First, please call the office to excuse your child and inform them of what time of day you will be picking up the work. I plan to have the assignments ready and on the student's desk by noon of the day they are ill. You may pick it up any time during the day after noon.

Third graders have been asked to serve as greeters for chapel. This week **Evelyn Ehlke and Ella Schmidt** will serve as greeters. I ask that the greeters dress nicely for chapel. ### **MRS. LINTON'S LETTER**

5<sup>th</sup> grade: This week we will "travel" to our first Ancient Civilization – Mesopotamia! The 5<sup>th</sup> graders have been looking forward to moving on to the civilizations. Reminder that the first quarter project is due October 18. Students may bring the model to school between October 15 and 18, and hand the paragraph on Thursday, October 18.



6<sup>th</sup> grade: Our lessons this week are Jesus Heals the Official's Son and Jesus and Nicodemus. We continue to discuss the blessings of baptism and will be learning The Sacrament of Holy Baptism as part of our memory work this week. I have been encouraging the students to study their memory work a bit each day so they are ready on Wednesday!

We had our first mid-module assessment in math last week and the class did well! They have a solid foundation in ratios and several of the methods we have been using to solve real-world problems. We have now moved to Topic C: Unit Rates, and the students are picking it up quickly. Notes on Topics C and D will come home today so you can see where we are headed in the second half of this module.

7<sup>th</sup> grade: We have moved on to verbs in our language class. The students wrote some very imaginative paragraphs about a newly discovered creature, featuring verbs describing its actions. They are a creative bunch, and I'm looking forward to reading more of their writing throughout the year!

8<sup>th</sup> grade: This week we'll begin Topic 10 in history, focusing on Industrial and Economic Growth following the Civil War. This week each student is illustrating an event for our timeline of the era.

### **MRS. WILK WRITES**

Sorry that I forgot to send in my Rambler to Mrs. Cull last week. I included anything still pertinent in this version.

This eighth grade class has been quite impressive in music class; we've reviewed recorder notes and performed in groups and solos in different time signature, keys, and styles of music. Last week the students listened to two measures of music and then aptly played it back; later in class we improvised on recorder while background music was played. Next week a musical theory quiz will be given.

We take our reading MAPS tests Thursday. Students chose this week because many other tests occurred last week. While there's nothing to study in preparation, a rested brain is helpful.

The conclusion of our reading of *Girl, Stolen* took place last week. Students chose between two assessments: a portion of the book to present as an interpretive prose selection next week or writing a five-page, typed essay due yesterday.

The class sings at Shepherd of the Hills on October 14, at the 8:00 A.M. service. We will warm up fifteen minutes prior. Eleven students will represent our class that day.

Such creative questions the students wrote last week for their interview of an assigned classmate. A series of three compare and contrast essays will be written using the information gleaned during this interview. We have almost completed the feature-by-feature format.

This weekend is our open house here at Good Shepherd. We will be showcasing some of the work this year and some of the instruments that we are blessed to have.

We have begun studying Martin Luther and writing paragraphs about him every day; in preparation for our upcoming research papers (Nov.) we are studying non-fiction in literature. Review of outlining, types of sentences, note-taking, and critical thinking is ongoing.

During the Friends Walk, the students were role models; some befriended the fourth graders. The Lord provided a window where the rain was reprieved. Our thanks to all those who made the day possible.

#### *Seventh Grade*

This week there will be a music theory quiz. The students have worked hard in reviewing time signatures, keys, recorder fingerings, and different styles of music.

### *Sixth Grade*

Such thoughtful paragraphs were written about the animal each student would choose to be if not a human. Each was to include a little-known fact as well. In addition to presenting speeches, each student should have submitted revised paragraphs yesterday. We are implementing Google Classroom; it's all online, and students can see my notes and revise accordingly. Thanks to Mr. Braun for helping the students navigate the site.

Wow! Some of the students have really progressed on reading music and performing on soprano recorder. As you can see by using Sycamore, the students have been performing consistently. Unfortunately, some of them haven't been using independent time to practice in other areas of the building wisely; they have lost those privileges. Hopefully their future actions will earn these privileges back.

The last of our interpretive prose speeches were performed yesterday. Hopefully you saw the rubric the day after your child performed his speech. With staggered performances, I need to wait to upload grades or it appears that some students earned F's.

### *Fifth Grade*

Hopefully the students have been not only practicing recorder but also their music flashcards as well. They should be ready for a quiz this Thursday or next.

## **A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

How well do you do dealing with change? There are two normal reactions to change. There are those who resist change and want things to remain the same. They are comfortable with the status quo. They know what's coming. They know what's expected of them and how to meet those expectations. Some would say these people are stuck in a rut. Others would say why change something that is working?

The other approach to change is to embrace it, even seek it. People with this reaction find change exciting and challenging. They welcome the challenge, even look forward to it. They think change keeps them on their toes and sharpens them. Others believe these people are unsettled and fly from one idea to the next without taking the time to really understand the change.

One approach is not better than the other. There are times when change is necessary and good. There are times when the status quo is good and should remain. The approaches to change are just different.

The world around us is constantly changing. Behaviors that were acceptable years ago are no longer acceptable. Other behaviors that are acceptable today would have been universally condemned just a few years ago. Change can be very confusing.

We can rejoice that we have a solid rock we can cling to, one that will never change. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, and today, and forever. Thank God he is!
