Congratulations to the class! 2/3 of the class read more than the required 4 book reports in October. 210 book reports were handed in by the class this month. Very proud of my Third Grade Readers. And, not surprising we have a tie for October Reader of the Month. **Kathryn Ehke** and **Ella Schmidt** both read the same number of books, 24. Way to go, girls.

During the month of November I am asking my students to hand in 6 book reports. Then in December, which is a short and very busy month, they are required to only hand in 2 book reports.

Grade Three will be having a test in Social Studies on Chapter 3 this coming Thursday, Nov. 8. Please encourage your child to bring their books home and begin reviewing for this test. The science test on Chapter 6 will be either Nov. 14 or 15.

### **MRS. LINTON'S LETTER**

Thank you to all the amazing parents who have provided dinner for the teachers this week! We truly appreciate your support and a delicious meal during such busy evenings.

5<sup>th</sup> grade: Your child will be bringing their shelter project home this week. If they need help carrying it, you can pick it up following your parent/teacher conference. Once again, great work, 5<sup>th</sup> grade!

On Monday the 5<sup>th</sup> graders were introduced to analyzing primary source documents using a portion of the Code of Hammurabi. We discussed how knowing when and for whom a document was written changes how we read and interpret the document. We will wrap up our chapter on Mesopotamia with a test on Thursday, November 1.

6<sup>th</sup> grade: This week in Christ Light we will discuss the Parable of the Sower and the Seed. Is God's Word falling on rocky or fertile soil in our hearts?

6<sup>th</sup> grade math is working with ratios in the context of percentages this week. This is the last topic in our ratio module, and by the end of the module students will be able to apply ratios and percentages in real-world scenarios. Looking ahead, our end of module assessment will be on Friday, November 9.

7<sup>th</sup> grade: Our verb unit continues with more irregular verbs this week. In writer's workshop, the students will begin revisions on the one page story they wrote this week.

8<sup>th</sup> grade: Monday we will be applying historical thinking skills as we analyze accounts of the Battle of Little Bighorn from three different sources. We then shift our focus to changes in industry and the economy in the late 1800's to finish out the week.
