A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL

On Monday evening, December 3, the voters' assembly of Good Shepherd met to issue a call for a new principal. Members of Shepherd of the Hills were welcome to attend and contribute to the discussion, but they could not vote on the candidates. According to the terms of the joint agreement between Good Shepherd and Shepherd of the Hills, Good Shepherd issues the call for the principal of the school.

The people at the meeting saw a slate of four candidates to consider for the position of principal. This slate of candidates came from the Commission on Lutheran Schools and the District President of the Southeast Wisconsin District of the WELS. The Joint Board of Lutheran Schools completed a qualifications form giving more details the Commission on Lutheran Schools and the District President regarding what Good Shepherd was looking for in its new principal. The faculty had the opportunity to give input to this form as did the Coordinating Council of Good Shepherd. The form stated Good Shepherd wanted a man with twelve years of experience in teaching and experience in or training for administration.

The people attending the meeting discussed the qualifications of each man on the list. The president of the congregation, Mark Frank, encouraged everyone who knew any of the men to share their knowledge. The people were free to ask questions, offer information, and share any concerns. After those assembled completed this discussion, the voters took a ballot vote indicating whom they preferred to call. Prayer for the Lord's blessing and guidance preceded all of the discussion and vote.

On the first ballot the voters chose to issue the call to Mr. Thomas Plitzuweit. Tom is 44 years old and has served the Lord for 21 years. He is married (Elizabeth) and has four children (16, 13, 11, and 7 years old). Elizabeth is a teacher at St. Mathew's Lutheran School, Oconomowoc, Wisconsin. Tom currently serves as the Associate Director of the Commission on Lutheran Schools for our Synod. Tom's past experience was at St. Paul Lutheran School in Plymouth, Nebraska.

Please include Tom and his family in your prayers as he deliberates this call and determines where the Lord would have him serve.
