BOARD OF LUTHERAN SCHOOLS

The Board met Monday, March 11, at 6:30 pm. Highlights of the meeting included adopting the school calendar for the 2019-2020 school year. This calendar calls for school opening on Monday, August 26, 2019 and ending on Thursday, May 28, 2020. The adopted calendar exceeds all state requirements for hours of instruction at all levels.

The Board also approved a change to our Mission Statement. This change acknowledges the partnership between Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church for operating the school.

In another act the Board approved the portion of the 2019-2020 Ministry Plan that deals with the direct educational expenses for the school.

In a final act for this meeting the Board is recommending a slight change to the bylaws of the Good Shepherd congregation. This change simply recognizes the fact that our school offers grades 3K through 8.

The Board meets again on April 8 at 6:30 pm.

Thermal Energy Project- In science, we are learning about temperature, specific heat, and the transfer of thermal energy. The students are challenged to create a device to maintain the temperature of ½ cup of hot water. The only restrictions are that it cannot use a premade insulating device (travel mug or thermos), it cannot use an external source of heat (hand warmers, candle, etc.), and it must be made by them (turning in a coffee cup). MRS. LINTON'S LETTER

5th grade: Last week 5th grade applied their knowledge of Greek architecture to build a structure using paper, index cards, and tape. Their challenge was to build a structure that could support the weight of one Social Studies textbook. Not only did they meet that challenge, several groups exceeded it – their structures held 16-22 books! They did an excellent job working in groups and demonstrating their understanding of the post and lintel system used by the Ancient Greeks. We are on track to wrap up our study with a test Friday, March 22.

6th grade: The students have been asking great questions in Christ Light as we walk through the final days of Jesus' life and his death and resurrection. Please help me encourage their spiritual growth by continuing to discuss the lessons with them at home and helping with memory work!

We are wrapping up Module 3 and will test on coordinate planes on Thursday, March 14. We will review in class on Wednesday.

7th grade: Research papers have been returned to the students. The students did well for their first time completing a major research project! We are taking a short break to begin a unit on modifiers, and next week will hear presentations with the visual aid on each of the animals the students researched.

8th grade: World War II is underway and we are working to understand the impact on the American home front. This week we will also examine the government's decision to move Japanese Americans to internment camps during the war and begin our Holocaust remembrance project.

A form for the field trip to the EAA Museum on Wednesday, April 3 was sent home today. Please note it needs to be returned by March 21, prior to spring break so I can give the EAA an accurate headcount. An e-mail was sent out to those who expressed interest in chaperoning, but we will need additional drivers to make the trip a success.

A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL


