\$100 PER-CHILD TAX REBATE

Beginning **May 15, 2018**, through **July 2, 2018**, eligible citizens can claim their **\$100 per-child tax rebate** on this website: childtaxrebate.wi.gov. Please note **the website will not go live until May 15 and claims cannot be submitted prior to May 15**. Those who claim the rebate will receive the money before school starts this fall and have the option to receive it through a check in the mail or direct deposit.

Anyone who is a resident of the State of Wisconsin and a citizen of the United States is eligible to receive \$100 for every dependent child living at home under the age of 18 as of December 31, 2017.

TUITION RATES

The tuition rate for next year for K-8, one child is \$1,795. The rates for families with more than one child attending will come out with the registration envelopes scheduled to go

home next week. This rate is an increase of \$145 per child. Tuition is based on operating costs for the school. No capital expenses are included in the tuition or the cost of education. The cost of education for the 2018-2019 school year is \$5,078 per child.

Tuition for 3K is \$1,157. 4K tuition is \$1,375.

CLEANING CHANGE

We recently completed a survey of parents asking their opinion about school cleaning on the weekends. The results of that survey showed that 103 of the 131 families who responded to the survey favored adding \$50 to each child's tuition to pay for weekend cleaning done by our cleaning service. The Board of Lutheran Schools approved this change. Part of the tuition increase for next year will be this \$50 charge per child for cleaning. This also eliminates signing up for weekend cleaning.

If this change creates a financial hardship for any family, please speak with Mr. Sievert regarding options that may be available.
