

WORD OF GOD CURRICULUM GUIDE FOR GOOD SHEPHERD LUTHERAN SCHOOL

Philosophy

We believe in the one true triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. God has revealed Himself and His love for us in His errorless Word, the Bible. God created all things; He created man and woman as the crown of his creation. Mankind's fall into sin has corrupted the entire human race, making all people deserve damnation. God, through his grace, love and mercy sent his Son Jesus to live a righteous life for us and die as payment for every person's sins. Everyone who through the work of the Holy Spirit believes that Jesus is his Savior receives forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. As redeemed children of God we show love to Him by obeying His Ten Commandments and sharing the Good News of Jesus with others.

Purpose

Our religion curriculum teaches students about their sin and Savior. Through the study of the Bible, students understand sin and its consequence of eternal death in hell. Understanding their need for a Savior, students know that Jesus lived a perfect life and made atonement for their sins through his suffering, death and resurrection. Heaven is theirs and the redemptive work of Jesus transforms their behaviors and relationships with others now and into adulthood.

Premises for Word of God Curriculum

We teach Word of God based on a number of premises that guide and control the entire curriculum. These premises are revealed to us by God in his Word. We accept them as essential to Christian nurture only because God the Holy Spirit has led us to this conviction by working faith in our hearts.

These premises are as follows:

1. God's Word is truth.
 - God's Word is verbally inspired, inerrant, and infallible.
2. God's Word is christocentric.
 - The chief purpose of the Bible is to reveal God's saving plan, which centers on Christ.
3. The two main teachings of God's Word are law and gospel.
 - The law teaches us God's holy will, that is, what He requires all people to do and not to do. Because all are sinful by nature and sin daily, the law also teaches us that we are all sinners who deserve God's punishment of death and eternal damnation.
 - The gospel teaches us the good news of God's grace and mercy. It proclaims that God in love sent Jesus to take away the sins of all people and that everyone who believes in Jesus has eternal life and salvation
4. God's Word is
 - the means by which God brought us to faith
 - the continuing motivation for living a life of faith-born love to God's glory

- the means God has given us to bring unbelievers to saving faith
- the means by which we continually nurture one another to grow in saving faith and to live a sanctified life

Objectives

These premises make it evident that a curriculum which is designed to carry out God-pleasing Christian nurture will be based on God's Word and will aim at carrying out the purposes for which God gave us his Word.

The general objectives of Christian nurture, therefore, are:

- that by learning the law, Christians realize ever more fully their sinfulness and utter helplessness to save themselves.
- that by learning the gospel, Christians grow in their knowledge of God the Father as their loving Creator and Preserver, God the Son and their gracious Redeemer, and God the Holy Spirit as their enlightening Sanctifier.
- that by learning the gospel, Christians keep growing in faith, ever more firmly embracing Christ as their only hope of salvation and accepting with childlike trust everything in the Bible as God's inspired and inerrant truth.
- that by learning the gospel as motivation and the law as a guide, Christians continue to grow in living lives of thanksgiving to God for his undeserved grace
- that by being trained in the proper use of law and gospel, Christians are enabled to use the gifts God has given them to share the saving faith with others and to nurture fellow Christians in this faith.
- that by continual personal and group Bible study, Christians grow daily in faith and in leading a Christian life.

Assessment

Students in Grades K-8 shall be assessed in the following ways:

- Formative assessments such as observations, reflections, journals, written quizzes, oral quizzes and exit cards.
- Summative assessments such as projects, memory work and written tests.

Exit Goals for Graduation

Through our Word of God Curriculum, our students will...

1. Learn the teaching of the law and realize their sinfulness and utter helplessness to save themselves.

2. Learn the teaching of the gospel, and grow in their knowledge of God the Father as their creator, God the Son as their Redeemer and Savior, and God the Holy Spirit as their Sanctifier.
3. Grow in their faith and ever more firmly embrace Christ as their only hope of salvation.
4. By the grace of the Holy Spirit believe everything in the Bible as God's inspired, inerrant truth.
5. Use the gospel message as motivation for living lives of thanksgiving to God for his undeserved grace.
6. Use the law as a mirror, curb and guide to live lives of thanksgiving to God for his undeserved grace.
7. Be trained in the proper uses of law and gospel so they can use their God-given gifts to share the saving faith with others, and to nurture fellow believers.
8. Recognize that they are saved simply through the saving work of Christ alone and are brought to faith by the Holy Spirit through the means of grace; the gospel in Word and Sacrament.
9. Live lives of service to God, not to be saved, but as a way to show thanks to God for his ultimate sacrifice and saving grace.
10. By the grace of the Holy Spirit, develop Christ-centered attitudes that reflect the love of Jesus such as:
 - Appreciating Jesus' love and forgiveness.
 - Trusting that Jesus is continually watching over us and protecting us.
 - Desiring to reach out to others to share the good news of the gospel.
 - Be grateful for the gift of salvation through Jesus Christ.
 - Desiring to show love for others.
 - Forgiving others when they sin.
 - Being thankful for all of God's blessings.
 - Desiring to hear the important message of God's Word.
 - Repenting of sins, and trusting in God's forgiveness.
 - Desiring to show love for God by serving him.

Performance Objectives- Kindergarten, Grades 1 and 2

Spiritual Truths

By the end of **Kindergarten, Grades 1 and 2**, students will:

- Know that the Bible is God's Word.
- Know that God created all things and made mankind the crown of His creation.
- Understand that sin came into the world through Adam and Eve.
- Understand that sin is any thought, word or action contrary to God's will.
- Realize they are sinful from birth.
- Know that Jesus is the Son of God and through Him forgiveness and heaven is theirs.
- Know that heaven and hell are real places.
- Realize that faith is a gift from God.
- Understand God as their Creator, Savior and Lord.
- Understand that pleasing words and actions are a loving response for all that God has done for them.

- Learn that in the Old Testament, God tells us about the creation of the world, fall into sin, promise of a Savior during the lives and times of people who lived before Jesus.
- To learn that in the New Testament, God tells us about the birth, perfect life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus during the lives and times of Jesus' ministry and the early Church.
- Commit to memory Bible verses, Christian hymns and songs of praise.

- Treasure Jesus as their Savior.
- Value themselves as children of God who are loved and forgiven.
- In view of God's mercy, be kind, patient and forgiving.

- Recognize material blessings as gifts from God for which they shall be thankful and share with others.
- Enjoy prayer as a means of talking to God.
- Respond to God's love through joyful singing of spiritual songs.
- Desire to grow in faith and love though studying God's Word and attending church regularly.

By the end of **Kindergarten, Grades 1 and 2**, students will:

- Grow in God's Word through daily devotions and Bible lessons.
- Forgive others as Christ has forgiven them.
- Pray regularly.
- Respond to God's goodness through songs of praise.
- Grow in their faith by regular church attendance with their family.
- Honor God by obeying parents and others in authority.
- Respond to God's love by sharing, working with and helping others.
- Tell others about Jesus.

- Know the Great Commission and look to share the good news of Jesus with everyone they meet.
