

A Personal Giving Plan for 2024

"Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops." (Proverbs 3:9) Giving offerings is not a matter of "keeping the lights on" at church or filling a budget. Offerings are part of your worship. They are a tangible way we express our thanks to God for all that he has done for us. It also demonstrates our trust in him to provide for our future needs. As we approach the New Year, we ask you to assess your income and give a percentage that reflects the physical and spiritual blessings God has given you. Consider also that your offering helps us take hold of the great ministry opportunities God is placing before us here at Good Shepherd and the Lord's work elsewhere.

We encourage each member to develop a giving plan for 2024 (See below for a simple option.). God's Word says, "On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income." (1 Corinthians 16:2) Having a plan doesn't have to be complicated. It helps you prioritize this aspect of your worship by setting aside money for the Lord and usually leads to better management of your finances as a whole. Giving Instructions

Online Giving

A free online giving service is available. Click on the "Offering" button on our website www.goodshepherdwels.org to take you to Vanco Services' secure website. There you can create a plan to give an offering from your checking or savings account. You can offer a one-time or regular

personal profile and a plan to give an offering from your checking or savings account. You can offer a one-time or regularly scheduled gift. The site gives you all the designation options available in our envelope packets. You may still participate in the gathering of the offering by writing "Simply Giving" on your envelope.

Offering Envelopes We also invite you to use offering envelopes. These will be available starting December 9th and 10th in the church narthex. Using envelopes is recommended over simply putting cash in the plate because it allows for tracking of giving for tax benefit purposes and for your own personal stewardship review. It also includes options for specific designations. Finally, placing a check or cash in an envelope each week is, in and of itself, a special way to prepare your heart for worship.

Special Gifts offered in memory of a loved one, or in honor of an anniversary, marriage, or other occasion will be listed in the monthly newsletter. Please include that request with the specific details when you offer your gift. For example: \$50 given for "Kid's Programs" in memory of John Smith by Pete and Jane Smith.

Charitable Contributions – Cash contributions cannot be claimed for a tax deduction unless they are supported by a receipt or statement from a qualifying organization. Contributions can be made by check and claimed without a receipt unless any single contribution is \$250 or more. For gifts to your home church, it is always best to use your offering envelopes. For gifts to other organizations, contribute by check, and if it is \$250 or more, require a receipt or statement.

WELS Planned Giving Assistance – Contact Mr. Scott Wagner, from the WELS Ministry of Christian Giving, at 605-231-7402 to set up charitable giving plans through your estate, to maximize tax advantages for charitable giving, and enable you to continue supporting the Lord's work even when you are in heaven. He can meet with you at no charge. Another option is Mr. Paul Snamiska, who serves as the KML Estate Plan/Deferred Gift Counselor, at 262-677-4051.

IRA Direct Giving – If you are over 70 ½ you can direct IRA distributions to our church and not be taxed for the proceeds. For more details on this tax wise way of giving, contact Mr. Jim Sievert.
