#### **Christ For Us and Christ In Us**

The Christian church year can be divided into two parts: the festival half of the church year and the non-festival half. The festivals include Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, and Pentecost. After Pentecost, which is May 28 this year, we begin the non-festival half of the church year.

From Pentecost to Christmas, there are no major festivals.

Another way of looking at the Christian church year is to divide it into two themes: Christ for us and Christ in us. During the festival half of the church year, we focus on what Jesus Christ did for us. He took human flesh and entered this fallen world as an infant (Christmas). Christ revealed himself as the Son of God and Savior of all people (Epiphany). Christ became sin for us and suffered the terrible punishment we should have faced (Lent). Christ triumphed over death for us (Easter). Having now ascended to heaven, Christ intercedes for us at God's right hand as he also rules all things in heaven and on earth for us. Finally, Christ sent his Holy Spirit for us, to lead us to faith and sustain us on our way heavenward.

The theme of the non-festival half of the church year is Christ in us. During this time of the year our focus remains on Jesus, but we examine more closely the fruit produced in the lives of Christians as Christ lives in us. Jesus promised, "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them." (John 14:23) The apostle Paul wrote to the Galatians about his new way of looking at life now that Jesus had made his home in him: "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." (Gal. 2:20) Our "Heroes of Faith" sermon series this summer will demonstrate what Christ did in and through the Old and New Testament heroes of faith, but it will also remind us that Christ is still doing heroic work in us and through us. Both "Christ for us" and "Christ in us" are important!
