PROVERBS - LIVING BY THE WISDOM OF CHRIST

Lesson Nine - Attitudes

1. Strife

A. What causes strife between people?

Proverbs 10:12 Hatred stirs up dissension, but love covers over all wrongs.

Proverbs 16:28 A perverse man stirs up dissension, and a gossip separates close friends.

Proverbs 26:20 Without wood a fire goes out; without gossip a quarrel dies down.

Proverbs 22:10 Drive out the mocker, and out goes strife; quarrels and insults are ended.

Proverbs 17:14 Starting a quarrel is like breaching a dam; so drop the matter before a dispute breaks out.

Proverbs 26:21 As charcoal to embers and as wood to fire, so is a quarrelsome man for kindling strife.

Proverbs 17:19 He who loves a quarrel loves sin; he who builds a high gate invites destruction.

Proverbs 27:17 As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another.

B. What dampens strife between people?

Proverbs 17:9 He who covers over an offense promotes love, but whoever repeats the matter separates close friends.

Proverbs 18:18 Casting the lot settles disputes and keeps strong opponents apart.

2. Temper

A. What sins can temper cause

Proverbs 29:22 An angry man stirs up dissension, and a hot-tempered one commits many sins.

Proverbs 16:29 A violent man entices his neighbor and leads him down a path that is not good.

Proverbs 21:7 The violence of the wicked will drag them away, for they refuse to do what is right.

Proverbs 29:11 A fool gives full vent to his anger, but a wise man keeps himself under control.

B. Why is revenge a selfish evil?

Proverbs 17:13 If a man pays back evil for good, evil will never leave his house.

Proverbs 20:22 Do not say, "I'll pay you back for this wrong!" Wait for the LORD, and he will deliver you.

Proverbs 24:29 Do not say, "I'll do to him as he has done to me; I'll pay that man back for what he did."

Proverbs 24:17 Do not gloat when your enemy falls; when he stumbles, do not let your heart rejoice, 18 or the LORD will see and disapprove and turn his wrath away from him.

3. Patience

Proverbs 15:18 A hot-tempered man stirs up dissension, but a patient man calms a quarrel.

Proverbs 19:11 A man's wisdom gives him patience; it is to his glory to overlook an offense.

Proverbs 25:15 Through patience a ruler can be persuaded, and a gentle tongue can break a bone.

4. Kindness and Gentleness

Proverbs 18:1 An unfriendly man pursues selfish ends; he defies all sound judgment.

Proverbs 11:17 A kind man benefits himself, but a cruel man brings trouble on himself.

Proverbs 11:16 A kindhearted woman gains respect, but ruthless men gain only wealth.

Proverbs 14:21 He who despises his neighbor sins, but blessed is he who is kind to the needy.

Proverbs 19:17 He who is kind to the poor lends to the LORD, and he will reward him for what he has done.

Proverbs 12:10 A righteous man cares for the needs of his animal, but the kindest acts of the wicked are cruel.

5. Generosity

Proverbs 11:24 One man gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty. 25 A generous man will prosper; he who refreshes others will himself be refreshed. 26 People curse the man who

hoards grain, but blessing crowns him who is willing to sell.

Proverbs 21:13 If a man shuts his ears to the cry of the poor, he too will cry out and not be answered.

Proverbs 22:9 A generous man will himself be blessed, for he shares his food with the poor.

Proverbs 25:21 If your enemy is hungry, give him food to eat; if he is thirsty, give him water to drink. 22 In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head, and the LORD will reward you.

Proverbs 22:16 He who oppresses the poor to increase his wealth and he who gives gifts to the rich--both come to poverty.

6. Friendship

Proverbs 25:19 Like a bad tooth or a lame foot is reliance on the unfaithful in times of trouble.

Proverbs 20:6 Many a man claims to have unfailing love, but a faithful man who can find?

Proverbs 18:24 A man of many companions may come to ruin, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother.

Proverbs 17:17 A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity.

Proverbs 27:9 Perfume and incense bring joy to the heart, and the pleasantness of one's friend springs from his earnest counsel.

Proverbs 27:6 Wounds from a friend can be trusted, but an enemy multiplies kisses.

Proverbs 28:23 He who rebukes a man will in the end gain more favor than he who has a flattering tongue.

7. True Colors

Proverbs 27:19 As water reflects a face, so a man's heart reflects the man.

Lesson Ten - Taming the Tongue

1. Lies and Deceit

A. People desire others to be honest and not to lie

Proverbs 19:22 What a man desires is unfailing love; better to be poor than a liar.

Proverbs 13:5 The righteous hate what is false, but the wicked bring shame and disgrace.

B. God hates lies and dishonesty, too

Proverbs 19:9 A false witness will not go unpunished, and he who pours out lies will perish.

Proverbs 21:28 A false witness will perish, and whoever listens to him will be destroyed forever.

Proverbs 19:28 A corrupt witness mocks at justice, and the mouth of the wicked gulps down evil.

C. Lies hurt other people

Proverbs 25:18 Like a club or a sword or a sharp arrow is the man who gives false testimony against his neighbor.

Proverbs 24:28 Do not testify against your neighbor without cause, or use your lips to deceive. 29 Do not say, "I'll do to him as he has done to me; I'll pay that man back for what he did."

Proverbs 26:28 A lying tongue hates those it hurts, and a flattering mouth

works ruin.

Proverbs 29:5 Whoever flatters his neighbor is spreading a net for his feet.

Proverbs 26:24 A malicious man disguises himself with his lips, but in his heart he harbors deceit. 25 Though his speech is charming, do not believe him, for seven abominations fill his heart. 26 His malice may be concealed by deception, but his wickedness will be exposed in the assembly.

2. Slander and Gossip

Proverbs 10:18 He who conceals his hatred has lying lips, and whoever spreads slander is a fool.

Proverbs 30:10 "Do not slander a servant to his master, or he will curse you, and you will pay for it.

Proverb 20:19 A gossip betrays a confidence; so avoid a man who talks too much.

Proverbs 26:22 The words of a gossip are like choice morsels; they go down to a man's inmost parts.

Proverbs 26:20 Without wood a fire goes out; without gossip a quarrel dies down.

Proverbs 25:9 If you argue your case with a neighbor, do not betray another man's confidence, or he who hears it may shame you and you will never lose your bad reputation.

3. Holding Your Tongue

Proverbs 10:19 When words are many, sin is not absent, but he who holds his tongue is wise.

Proverbs 11:12 A man who lacks judgment derides his neighbor, but a man

of understanding holds his tongue.

Proverbs 17:28 Even a fool is thought wise if he keeps silent, and discerning if he holds his tongue.

Proverbs 17:27 A man of knowledge uses words with restraint, and a man of understanding is even-tempered.

Proverbs 18:13 He who answers before listening-- that is his folly and his shame.

Proverbs 29:20 Do you see a man who speaks in haste? There is more hope for a fool than for him.

Proverbs 26:17 Like one who seizes a dog by the ears is a passer-by who meddles in a quarrel not his own.

4. Speaking the Truth

Proverbs 12:22 The LORD detests lying lips, but he delights in men who are truthful.

Proverbs 20:15 Gold there is, and rubies in abundance, but lips that speak knowledge are a rare jewel.

Proverbs 12:18 Reckless words pierce like a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.

Proverbs 26:18 Like a madman shooting firebrands or deadly arrows 19 is a man who deceives his neighbor and says, "I was only joking!" Proverbs 10:32 The lips of the righteous know what is fitting, but the mouth of the wicked only what is perverse.

Proverbs 11:9 With his mouth the godless destroys his neighbor, but through knowledge the righteous escape.

Proverbs 15:7 The lips of the wise spread knowledge; not so the hearts of fools.

Proverbs 24:26 An honest answer is like a kiss on the lips.

Proverbs 18:20 From the fruit of his mouth a man's stomach is filled; with the harvest from his lips he is satisfied. 21 The tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love it will eat its fruit.

Proverbs 16:1 To man belong the plans of the heart, but from the LORD comes the reply of the tongue.

5. Comforting Speech

Proverbs 14:10 Each heart knows its own bitterness, and no one else can share its joy.

Proverbs 14:13 Even in laughter the heart may ache, and joy may end in grief.

Proverbs 12:25 An anxious heart weighs a man down, but a kind word cheers him up.

Proverbs 15:23 A man finds joy in giving an apt reply-- and how good is a timely word!

Proverbs 16:24 Pleasant words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones.

Proverbs 25:11 A word aptly spoken is like apples of gold in settings of silver.

Proverbs 25:20 Like one who takes away a garment on a cold day, or like vinegar poured on soda, is one who sings songs to a heavy heart.
