We are grateful that 241 families/individuals have promised \$843,296 towards our Building People Connections campaign to reduce or eliminate our \$1.2 million expansion mortgage.

\$591,684 has already been received. Our expansion mortgage is now down to \$599,000. Please keep up with your pledged amounts. Building Connections envelopes are available in your envelope packet or in the narthex.

Ministry Structure Update

Our ministry is overseen by our Coordinating Council and six boards – Adult Nurture, Family Nurture, Outreach, School, Worship, and Support.

Our Coordinating Council has appointed two Member Ministry Coordinators, Marilyn Sievert and Catherine Moldenhauer to help our boards and coordinators develop written position descriptions and action plans.

We are also working a WELS ministry consultant Lori Lorig to enhance our member ministry at Good Shepherd. This helps us carry out one of our congregational Action Plan goals – Help our members discover their spiritual gifts and link them to service.

Adoption of new WELS Hymnal - On August 22nd our voters approved plans to adopt the use of our new WELS hymnal beginning in Advent 2021.
