Buried With Christ

Or don't you know that all of us who <u>were baptized</u> into Christ Jesus <u>were baptized into his death</u>? 4 We <u>were therefore buried with him</u> through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. Romans 6:3–4 (NIV)

It may not jump out at us that saying "you were baptized" is saying more than this happened in the past. "Were baptized" and "were buried" are passive verbs. In baptism God does something to us and for us that we could not even begin to accomplish on our own. We cannot reach across the miles and through the centuries to somehow bury ourselves with Christ.

In your baptism God connected you to salvation history. He buried you with Christ, declaring his death to be your death, his payment for sin, your payment for sin. The connection didn't end there. He also raised you with Christ, giving you spiritual life.

All this is his gracious gift, not something we earn or deserve by doing good things. The gift is a gift of new life. We were spiritually dead, unable to do anything with any worth or value. This new life shows itself in valuable works of love freely done to his glory and to thank our Savior. That, too, is his precious gift to us through baptism. Pursue that new life!

Ministry Structure and Bylaw Update

In 2019 Good Shepherd leaders gathered input from leaders of various areas of ministry and a cross section of our members concerning key areas of ministry to enhance. Our Action Plan includes these goals.

• Initiate a congregation-wide member ministry effort helping God's people discover their strengths and linking them to service.
